Sports Students take on a cycle to Paris!

Back in May, our sports students planned and took part in their own fundraising challenge in honour of the Olympics/Paralympics. They cycled the distance from QAC to Paris to raise money for new sports equipment. After a successful (if not gruelling) week in and out of the gym using the hand cycles and exercise bikes they clocked up the 412 miles required and raised an incredible £395 in doing so.

Our sports and hospitality students hosted various guests for an inclusive sports session, introducing them to new para-sports. New term brings new improvements

As we enter the new term, we are thrilled to announce various initiatives and developments that will enhance the learning experience for our students, that have taken place over the summer months.

Returning students will have noticed huge improvements in both our Evolution and Bradbury buildings. Thanks to the generous support, from the Birmingham Royal Institute for the Blind we were able to renovate and upgrade our toilet facilities in both of these buildings.

Our students working in IT and Creative media will also be dazzled by the results of a grant from the Karten Network. Thanks to their continued support the Karten Centre has acquired new interactive screens, desktops, monitors, and laptops.

A huge thanks also goes to the Harborne Parish Lands Charitable Trust for enabling us to create an allotment at the Court Oak Road allotments for our students to use to support their horticultural learning. The funding we have received is being used to buy tools, equipment, and other necessary items to establish and run the plot for educational purposes.

Coming Soon

Looking ahead, we have some exciting fundraising projects in the pipeline including the introduction of covered walkways. Thanks to the Eveson Trust, we are set to implement the first of our covered walkways on site during the October Half Term, which will greatly benefit our students, particularly those with visual impairments.

Support for Community Services

Our Community Service Hub, previously located next to the college, has now been moved to our Umberslade site. They are settling in well and have already set up designated areas for various activities. These include growing spaces, a sensory garden, buildings for craft activities and games, a fully functional kitchen, and social spaces. A large part of this service relies on charitable donations and we are so grateful to the CB and HH Taylor 1984 Trust and the We Are Making A Difference charity for supporting this work.

Ricoh Europe

Over the last year we have been fortunate to have a group of staff members from Ricoh Europe get involved with the charity.

Led by Vanessa Anness, the team have visited on a number of occasions - the SporTea event, bringing their expertise and experience to the table and taking a session with our Creative Media/IT students and more recently fundraising to enable the QAC Football team to have their very own kit! We're so grateful for their continued support.

Hitting the Target

Ian, who runs our archery clubs for staff, clients and students approached the fundraising office earlier in the year wondering if it might be possible to fundraise for some new equipment - he was running out of old broken kit to take apart to mend existing equipment! Thanks to support from a Sport England Award and GB Archery working in conjunction with The Fletchers Trust, QAC are the proud owners of brand new archery equipment to the value of £3,500.

Rebrand Launch

In July, we launched our rebrand, marking an exciting new chapter for QAC. Queen Alexandra College, now known as Queen Alexandra Charity Birmingham demonstrates a better understanding of our services. Our work with students and clients are now represented through our four areas - College, Residential, Community Services and Enterprises. 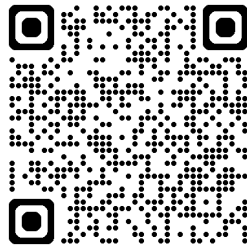
WILL YOU JOIN US?

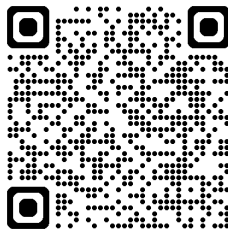
