

Recipe of the Day Potato Gnocchi

Ingredients:

- 1 kg floury potatoes, such as Maris Piper, King Edward
- 100 g Tipo 00 flour, plus extra for dusting
- 1 whole nutmeg, for grating

Method:

- Use potatoes of a fairly even size, as you're going to cook them whole. Cook in a
- large pan of boiling salted water for 20 to 25 minutes, or until tender.
- Drain and leave until cool enough to handle, then remove the skins.
- Mash the potatoes using a potato ricer or masher on to a large clean board.
- Sprinkle over the flour, finely grate over half the nutmeg, season well with sea salt
- and black pepper, then scrunch and push the mixture together with clean hands.
- Depending on the potatoes, you may need to add a little more flour
- use yourcommon sense.


- Knead on a flour-dusted surface for a few minutes until pliable, then divide into 4 equal pieces and roll each into a sausage about 2cm thick.
- Slice into 3cm lengths this is your basic gnocchi. Now you can gently roll each piece down a butter pat, the back of a fork or a fine grater to add grooves, which will help your sauce to stick, or simply roll into balls.
- Cook 2 portions at a time, as it's so quick, and it also means they're less likely to break up. Cook in a pan of boiling salted water for 2 to 3 minutes
- as soon as they come up to the surface, they're ready.
- Remove with a slotted spoon and toss with melted butter and finely grated Parmesan, my Hero tomato sauce (or leftover sauce from a stew, which you can see in the picture), then finely grate over a little Parmesan, to serve. I also like to add a little dollop of pesto homemade or jarred, it's up to you.

Flapjack Biscuits

Ingredients

- -100 g unsalted butter, (at room temperature)
- 100 g mixed dried fruit & amp; nuts
- 100 g porridge oats
- 100 g self-raising flour
- 100 g golden syrup



Method


- Preheat the oven to 180°C/350°F/gas 4.
- Line a deep 20cm square baking tin with greaseproof paper and rub with olive oil.
- Pulse the butter, dried fruit and nuts, oats and flour in a food processor until the mix comes together and away from the sides, then pulse in the syrup until fully combined.
- Transfer to the lined tin, flattening to the edges. Bake for 15 to 20 minutes, or until golden.
- Remove from the oven, slice into 16 squares ready to cut, and leave to cool in the tin for 5 minutes.





Space Word Wheel



Recipe of the Day Butter Bean and Chorizo Stem

Ingredients:

- 200g cooking chorizo
- 2 x 400g cans chopped tomatoes
- 2 x 400g cans drained butter beans
- 1 tub fresh pesto

Method:

- Slice the chorizo and tip into a large saucepan over a medium heat. Fry gently for 5 mins or until starting to turn dark brown. Add the tomatoes and butter beans, bring to the boil, then simmer for 10 mins. Swirl through the pesto, season lightly and ladle into four bowls.







Stevie Wonder

American singer, songwriter, and multi-instrumentalist Stevie Wonder was born May 13 th 1950 in Michigan.

Blind from birth and raised in inner-city Detroit, he was a skilled musician by age eight. Stevie made his recording debut at age 12. The soulful quality of his high-pitched singing and the frantic harmonica playing that characterised his early recordings were evident in his first hit single, "Fingertips (Part 2)," recorded in 1963.

Over the following years Stevie had hits with "I Was Made to Love Her," "My Cherie Amour" (both co-written with producer Henry Cosby), and "For Once in My Life," songs that suited dancers as well as lovers.

'Where I'm Coming From', an album released in 1971, hinted not merely at an expanded musical range but, in its lyrics and its mood. Music of My Mind (1972) had been strongly influenced by Marvin Gaye's What's Going On, the album in which his Motown stablemate moved away from the label's "hit factory" approach to confront the divisive social issues of the day. These albums produced a steady stream of classic hit songs, among them "Superstition," "You Are the Sunshine of My Life," "Higher Ground," "Living for the City," "Don't You Worry 'Bout a Thing," "Boogie On Reggae Woman," "I Wish," and "Sir Duke."

Although still only in his mid-20s, Stevie appeared to have mastered virtually every idiom of African-American popular music and to have synthesized them all into a language of his own.

His command of the new generation of electronic keyboard instruments made him a pioneer and an inspiration to rock musicians, the inventiveness of his vocal phrasing was reminiscent of the greatest jazz singers, and the depth and honesty of his emotional projection came straight from the black church music of his childhood. Such a fertile period was unlikely to last forever, and it came to an end in 1979 with a fey and overambitious extended work called Stevie Wonder's Journey through the Secret Life of Plants. Thereafter his recordings became sporadic and often lacked focus, although his concerts were never less than rousing. The best of his work formed a vital link between the classic rhythm-and-blues and soul performers of the 1950s and '60s and their less commercially constrained successors. Yet, however sophisticated his music became he was never too proud to write something as apparently slight as the romantic gem "I Just Called to Say I Love You" (1984). (I bet you're singing it now!)

Stevie was the recipient of numerous honours. He was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1989, and in 1999 he was awarded the Polar Music Prize for lifetime achievement by the Royal Swedish Academy of Music. In 2005 he received a Grammy Award for lifetime achievement. Four years later he was awarded the Gershwin Prize for Popular Song from the Library of Congress.

Solar Plant Pot Water Fountain

What you'll need:

- 2 plastic or glazed plant pots in different sizes
- 1 plastic or glazed flower pot saucer
- 1 plastic pail
- River rocks
- Solar Power Fountain Pump


Instructions:

- Level the ground that the pump will sit on. You could use a broken paving stone to set the fountain on to keep it off the dirt.
- Base flower pot. Set the largest pot on top of the stone.
- Tiered plant pot riser. Insert a large pail (or whatever you have on hand) into the bottom pot.
- Base for second flower pot. You will need a large saucer for the second pot to sit on.
- Stack the second flower pot. Stack the smaller flower pot in the centre and fill the saucer with river rocks for decoration.
- Fill the top flower pot with water. If your top flower pot has a drainage hole, it will need to be sealed so the water doesn't drain out the pot. One option is to place a tile over the hole and secure it with silicone. Run a bead of silicone all around the edge of the tile as well to ensure a tight seal. Let the silicone cure for at least 24 hours before filling the top flower pot with water.

- Add the solar pump. Drop and go and let the solar panel do the work!
- How to keep the solar pump in the centre of the flower pot.

Now you may be wondering what those four galvanized wires are about. Because the pump floats on top of the water if it moves towards the edge of the pot, the spray will flow over the pot and drain the water more rapidly from the flower pot.

Here's a tip for keeping the solar pump centred so the spray lands back inside the flower pot. Insert galvanized wires into the foam floatation's on the pump. Cut the wires to fit the distance from the pump to the sides of the pot.

How to Upcycle Old Furniture

What you'll need:

- Dust sheet
- Dust mask
- Paint brush
- Sandpaper
- Metal paint
- Furniture paint in your chosen colour (you can buy this from your local DIY store)
- Sponge
- Primer
- Dust brush
- Roller & tray

Method

- 1. On bare wood, lightly sand the surface removing any rough edges.
- 2. Remove excess dust using a dust brush or damp cloth.
- 3. Apply a primer, remembering to stir it well.
- 4. Wait for the primer to dry before sanding down your piece of furniture, ready for the first coat of your chosen colour.
- 5. Paint your furniture evenly for the best finish.
- 6. Wait for the first coat to dry before adding any more coats of paint.
- 7. If you're adding detail with a second colour, mask off areas that could get splashed with paint.
- 8. Paint smaller areas with a brush and larger areas with a roller to save time.
