The one acre site, based on Umberslade Road in Selly Oak, is the latest addition to our family of Social Enterprises. Although a 'work in progress' lots of projects have already commenced, with retail, training and work experience opportunities taking place. The retail shop, open Wednesday-Sunday, 10-4pm, offers everything you need to help brighten your garden from tools and equipment to bedding plants and seeds.

As a working horticulture site, there is lots of gardening and maintenance to be done and this, along with the retail shop, offers plenty of opportunities for work experience and jobs for our students and clients. We have Independence Plus and advance2work clients based there getting their hands dirty and gaining valuable experience along the way.

Umberslade regularly welcomes some of our PfL student groups who help to plant, dig and weed according to season. Recently, we have also had groups of volunteers

from Midlands Co-Operative Energy and Department for Work & Pensions taking a few hours away from the office to get their hands dirty.

Moving forward we have lots of ideas about how we see the site developing, offering more for our students and the local community. We hope to introduce a small tea room with opportunities for local artists and crafters to display their work. Outside, we are looking to develop a nature meadow, bee keeping and nature trail as well as a recognised Forest School project. These projects will create more volunteering opportunities and enable local schools and community groups to learn about wildlife and the natural environment around them.

It's a really exciting project for QAC and we'll keep you updated. For now, the Umberslade team look forward to seeing you soon!

Sport, Sport and More Sport!

Sport always features highly at QAC and we are extremely lucky to have links with local sporting organisations which enables us to develop more opportunities for students to take part in various sports.

- Since February, we have been working in partnership with the Disability Football Development Fund (DFDF), Aston Villa and University of Birmingham to enable a group of 10 students to develop their game and play Football on a state of the art 3G pitch. Weekly sessions have been delivered under the watchful eye of Head Coach, Nigel Macrow, who assures us that our entry into the Ability Counts League would not be out of place.
- Following taster sessions of Wheelchair Rugby delivered by Great Britain Wheelchair Rugby (GBWR), 2 students (Kerri Webley and Suraj Dail) out of the original 5 have since been selected to play for the newly formed team West Midland Warriors. Talent was also showcased at a Wheelchair Rugby event in Stoke on Trent in April, with a link to an interview with Suraj on our Facebook page.
- During the spring term, QAC worked with Maddie Millichap from British Rowing and the QAC Feelgood Fitness Centre to deliver indoor rowing sessions as part of a Rowability Project in Birmingham. 9 students were included in a virtual league, taking part in rowing challenges including individual distance and timed events. Sessions were developed during the summer term to include 3 outdoor Rowing sessions on Edgbaston Reservoir, working with Head Coach Hannah Read (Youth Rowing in Birmingham).
- 7 students and 4 staff took part in this year's Lake Coniston trip where they had the opportunity to have a go at a range of watersports and rock climbing activities.
