Sporting Success!

A lot has been happening in the world of sport already this term, and not just in our sports hall!

Seventeen brave students have taken part in water sport activities at Edgbaston Reservoir. The project is part of a Sport Birmingham project funded by Sportivate with sessions running over a six week period.

Students and staff attended weekly sessions where they got to experience a range of activities, including the occasional speedy thrill aboard the safety boat, whilst being coached by experienced sailing instructors.

Everyone had a great time, with 'Storm Abigail' making an appearance at one of the sessions. The group will return in Spring next year for phase two of the project.

A team of 11 students were selected to be 'The QAC Challengers' and played in the Regional CP Sports Table Cricket Competition held at Edgbaston Cricket Ground. Although they lost all of their first round matches, they came back fighting in the second round to come third overall; a great achievement!



The team will practice their skills over the next few months in our Table Cricket Club before competing in The Lord's Taverners Table Cricket Competition in February.

Closer to home, our Judo Club has gone from strength to strength, and a donation from Zurich enabled it to continue this year, 21 students attend the weekly club, delivered by Jason Allen, a British and Commonwealth Champion. In November we held a grading presentation to award them their belts ranging from red to yellow to orange.

The ceremony allowed students to showcase their technical ability, understanding and knowledge of Japanese terminology in front of fellow students, families and other guests.

Employment Pathways

Our Employment Pathways team have been very busy this term.

Students on our Supported Internship programme have had the opportunity to work in a range of roles with employers including National Grid in Solihull, The Co-Op in Stirchley and Edgbaston Cricket Ground.



The team organised 'Work Experience Week' in October. A number of employers came to to talk to QAC students about their work and some groups were lucky enough to visit employers across the city. We also welcomed students from St Paul's Community Trust School who visited our newly refurbished Trade Skills department to learn tiling skills.

SEPTEMBER

The 2015/16 academic year began and as well as seeing familiar faces return, we also welcomed many who were new to the QAC Community. As part of this we introduced three new PFL groups; so hello to PFL Amber, PFL Bronze and PFL Grey!

At the start of term a group of Sport students and staff volunteered at the Sainsbury's National School Games in Manchester. After training on the first day they did a number of different jobs at venues across the city. As well as working hard, the group also visited a number of landmarks, watched the opening ceremony and met Paralympian Hannah Cockroft.

Following successful fundraising, we have been able to develop our Trade Skills area to include three 'work bays' for students to practice tiling and decorating skills. The department is also equipped with a range of professional tools and materials to enhance students' experiences.

OCTOBER

Four students went on a trip to Shakespeare's birthplace in Stratford as part of their English studies. They attended a lecture on the dramatic effects of some scenes in Romeo & Juliet, a multi-media artefact exhibition and visited the house where Shakespeare was born. Students have used the trip to help with their studies on Romeo & Juliet and in writing their own work.

A group of IP clients visited the Birmingham Hippodrome to see 'Annie' the musical. They had a great view and an amazing time, singing along with the cast!

Ten students visited Holbeache Farm in Kidderminster where they helped feed animals, learned about health and safety on a farm and polished brass buckles for show shire horses as part of their work experience.

NOVEMBER

Pudsey Power came to QAC with students and staff getting involved in fundraising activities for Children in Need. Hospitality students served a range of delicious treats (including Pudsey cookies!), raising over £165; PFL Silver sold handmade crafts raising almost £20 and our annual 'Penny Trail' organised by PFL Green lined the Bradbury Centre, raising a record £236. Money was still being counted well into November, with the total nudging towards £500 which is fantastic! Well done to everyone involved!

Brandhall Community Choir returned to QAC to perform for our IP and Residential students. Students, clients and staff joined the singing with many a well known song and carol being sung before everyone enjoyed a festive treat and chat.

Some IP clients and staff joined Hugh, our Principal, at a meeting at St. Germain's Church in Edgbaston. The group represented QAC and presented to over 50 people, speaking about the work of QAC, including Independence Plus and our various Social Enterprises. They did a great job, and really enjoyed the experience.

A team of students and staff exhibited at the Skills Show, held at the NEC. The show is the UK's leading experiential skills and career show for young people. Our team was asked to demonstrate a skill which the College teaches and the team chose to focus their attention on visual impairment, sharing skills and personal experience with visitors. They also had a range of equipment available to show what they use when working with students to develop their independent living skills.



Following recent funding from Sportivate, we began our widely anticipated trampolining project. 20 students attended the first taster session, which will be followed by a further seven sessions. We are very lucky to be working with Deb Danks, Head Coach at local trampolining club Activ8.

DECEMBER

Festive knits, Santa hats, crafts and hyacinth planters were abound as the PFL Christmas Fayre took over the hall and Bradbury Centre. Everyone got into the spirit of Winter Woolly Day, donning a range of festive attire for the occasion.

The festive fun continued as PFL groups amazed audiences in their 'Wizard of Oz' themed Christmas Show and Performing Arts students dazzled in their rendition of 'Oliver'!

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AQA **Unlocking Potential**

In our last newsletter we mentioned how two students had been chosen to take part in the AQA Unlocking Potential Programme in conjunction with the Dame Kelly Holmes Trust.

The programme aims to help make a positive impact on the lives of the nominees, encouraging them to help others and aim high in life. Being selected to take part is an amazing achievement, only 40 young people from across the UK were chosen.

For the programme, participants are matched with high achieving athletes who will mentor and guide them throughout their as powerchair football players, they will train for project. Although George Coleman left QAC in the summer, student Zach Brookes has continued to work with Mikail Huggins (Paralympic guide runner), his mentor for the project.

Zach chose a project focussing on education about transexual issues, something very close to his heart. As part of this he delivered a presentation to almost 30 students and staff about his journey, and to over 100 people at The Big Lottery about how to work with people who are transexual. He also spoke about his project at a celebratory event in December.

Throughout the process Zach has shown a great deal of passion, enjoying the challenge. Mikail also got a lot from the experience, commenting "I'm proud of Zach, working with him has made me develop in many ways, he is an inspiration".

Elite Powerchair Football comes to QAC We are delighted to be working with The Albion

Foundation to deliver the first collaborative Powerchair Football and Further Education Elite study programme of its kind in the whole country, exclusively for high need students, starting in September 2016.

The programme has been specifically designed for ambitious young sports people with high needs aged 16-24 years old who are passionate about football, coaching and sports leadership, use a power or manual wheelchair and are eligible under the Federation of International Powerchair Football Association (FIPFA) classification criteria.

Offering students the opportunity to develop twelve hours per week (the recommended time to become an elite performer) plus attend QAC for a timetabled programme of vocational qualifications, independence, employment and functional skills.

The NEED Project is an exciting new project, started here at QAC that aims to encourage large national employers to help more young people with learning disabilities into paid employment.

The project is going from strength to strength and we have recently expanded our team as a result. We are now working with several Local Authorities to help develop Supported Internship programmes, again helping more young people to find work.

We work with many large employers to help them understand how their recruitment processes could be changed to help more people with disabilities to not only find work but also to find fulfilling career development.

Our current partner employers include Marks and Spencer, The BBC. Odeon Cinemas and Sealife Centres.

We have ambitious plans for the project moving forwards and are looking for more people to help us deliver. We need people with project management skills who feel as strongly as we do about getting more young people with learning disabilities into employment and would be able to work for a number of days each year delivering our message and methodology to help employers gain the knowledge and confidence they need to diversify their workforce and support all their employees.

QAC Stakeholder Feedback

We take a great deal of pride in what we do and as part of that continually monitor the quality of provision and experiences for students and stakeholders.

Each year we ask them to input into into our review. Below are some highlights from the 2014/15 report.

Student Success

Students achieving their main learning aim 88%
Up 1% on previous academic year.



Student Satisfaction

Overall student satisfaction was 98% Up by 5% on the 2014 survey.

Student Destinations

56 students left in July 2015 and progressed to positive destinations this included:

29 % went onto Further Education
Up by 3% on previous academic year.
13% gained voluntary employment
Up by 1% on previous academic year.
23% went onto another QAC programme.

Employer Engagement

Overall 'Employer Satisfaction' 91 % rated QAC as good or outstanding, Up by 5% on the previous year (2013/14) Employers told us: "Staff communicated very well and gave us good guidance on the needs students. They also supported the students and treated them with respect - giving them the confidence to improve their skills" and "Client X started here as a work placement, he worked really hard and made such an impression that he is now one of our employees".

Student Retention

98% of students were retained on their course; the same as for the previous academic year.

Inspection Outcomes

Ofsted Learning & Skills Inspection 'Overall Effectiveness' grade June 2011 Inspection Grade = Good (2)

Teaching and Learning

College KPI - 85% of lessons at or above expected professional standard (outstanding or good) 94.5% for the academic year (including round 1&2) Up by 11.5% on last academic year.

Parent Engagement

Overall 'Parent Satisfaction' was 93% which is up 1% on previous academic year.

One parent said: "QAC has offered my daughter structure. She is progressing well not only educationally but also socially. For the first time since being in education she feels comfortable which is all down to QAC staff".
